

Introduction

The Western Region Academy of Sport (WRAS) commenced operation in July 1991 as a non-profit organisation. WRAS is one of 11 academies established in NSW to provide support to the region's talented athletes, and to attempt to eliminate the disadvantages country athletes face in comparison to their city counterparts. Athletes from throughout the region are offered scholarship in squads (Sport Talent Enhancement Programs) and individually (Individual Talent Enhancement Programs).

Location

The WRAS office is located in the CD Blake Auditorium, Charles Sturt University, Bathurst. The WRAS catchment covers a geographical region of 91,930 square kilometres, which is one of the largest areas covered by a NSW academy. The region covers 17 local government areas: Bathurst Regional, Bland, Blayney, Cabonne, Cowra, Dubbo Regional, Forbes, Gilgandra, Hilltops, Lachlan, Lithgow, Mid-Western Regional, Narromine, Oberon, Orange, Parkes and Weddin.

WRAS Sports

The Western Region Academy of Sport currently provides scholarships to over 150 athletes, conducting squad programs in afl, basketball, cycling, golf, hockey, harness racing, netball and swimming. There are three components of our individual program — High Performance, Lone Star and Para-sports. WRAS considers sports recognised by NSW Office of Sport for inclusion in future intakes.

Academy Management and Structure

Being a non-government and community-based organisation, WRAS is currently governed by a board consisting of 7 members who are nominated and elected or appointed from within the western region community. The Board formulates and reviews all strategic direction and policies of the Academy.

WRAS employs a full time executive officer, a part time sports program manager and a part time office manager. The sports programs are supported by volunteer squad staff

Funding

WRAS is a not-for-profit incorporated association and relies on a variety of funding sources to continue its work. WRAS receives an annual grant from the NSW Government through the Office of Sport and in-kind sponsorship from Charles Sturt University. These two contributions make up less than 50% of the total annual income. Seventeen local councils also contribute financially and in-kind. The remainder of funding is obtained through squad athlete levies, sponsorships, sports body donations and other sundry income.
